This "Young Investor: Exploring the World of Stocks" course Agreement (the "Agreement") is made and entered into on [_____] (the "Effective Date") between **P3 Traders**, with a mailing address of 13272 Brass Ring Lane, Eastvale, CA (the "Course Provider"), and [_____], with a mailing address of [_____] (the "Participant"). The Participant is under the age of 18 and therefore this Agreement must be signed by a parent or legal guardian of the Participant (the "Parent").

WHEREAS, the Course Provider offers a stock market course (the "Course") designed to educate individuals on the fundamentals of investing in the stock market;

WHEREAS, part of the course the Participant will be provided **access to the proprietary software** for the course period to complete the course. ****Software works only on the windows machines and will not work on Mac or mobile devices.**

WHEREAS, parent or legal guardian of the Participant should **open a brokerage account** and provide ONLY PAPER ACCOUNT access to the students.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. **COURSE DESCRIPTION:** The Course will provide the Participant with a basic understanding of the stock market and how to invest in it. The Course will cover topics such as stock market terminology, stock market analysis, and risk management. Please refer the next pages for further details.
2. **COURSE SCHEDULE:** The Course will consist of minimum **12 weekly sessions**, each of which will last an hour. The Course will be held on **every Sunday 8 AM to 9 AM PST** from the course start date.
3. **COURSE FEES.** The Participant shall pay the Course Provider a fee of **\$300** for access to the Course. The Course Provider shall provide the Participant with payment instructions upon execution of this Agreement.
4. **REFUNDS:** The Course Provider will provide a full refund to the Participant if the Participant cancels the Course before the first day of the course. No refunds will be given after that.
5. **INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY:** The Course Provider retains all intellectual property rights in the Course materials. The Participant agrees not to reproduce or distribute the Course materials or the software credentials without the Course Provider's written consent.
6. **DISCLAIMER:** The Course Provider does not guarantee the accuracy or completeness of the Course materials or any results obtained from the Course. The Course Provider is not responsible for any losses incurred by the Participant as a result of participating in the live market with real money.
